Based on a true story from the 1890's, a young girl writes a letter to the editor of the *New York Sun* newspaper. "Dear Editor, I am eight years old. Some of my little friends say there is no Santa Claus. Papa says if you see it in the *Sun*, it's so. Please tell me the truth. Is there a Santa Claus?" Ed Mitchell, the *Sun's* editor, assigns Frank Church—a reporter on the verge of self destruction—the task of answering Virginia's question. Church's quest and reply have become one of the world's most-quoted and beloved editorials.

Feature Gallery



Sonofmel & Slideman are a North American duo who mix stories in song and spoken word with acoustic grooves, spacious slide, and specialty guitars, combining elements of outlaw country and world-wide travel for an ethereal style of Americana, with a passport. Sometimes it takes traveling far from home to find out where you come from... after 20 years and over 70 occupations, Sonofmel returns to the midwest with



fistfuls of chords strung up in storied verse. Having traveled parts of the world sifting the sacred from the profane, he brings the foreign home to the familiar. He's recently teamed up with Jordan Grunow, who accentuates and builds upon Sonofmel's travel narratives in song and spoken word with everything from angelic slide and 8 stringed weissenborns to driving guitar, all to spread spacious, sonic frosting over an often improvised mix. Sonofmel won 2017 International Dylanfest songwriter honors and Duluth's 2017 One Week Live singer/songwriter of the year.

Your purchase of a unique gift helps both the artist and the Center.




Workshops


Embroidery Circle **Wednesday, 1-3 pm** **(no meeting on November 21)**

SPOTLIGHT on **Sidney “Ski” Miller**




Sidney Miller, widow of artist Albert W. Miller, has honored the Galena Center for the Arts with a gift of paintings by her husband. The group includes nine portraits of Galenians as well as three other pieces, all painted when they lived in Galena.

An artist in her own right, Sidney has won awards for her fiber art. Representing Illinois, her quilt for the 100th Liberty Bell anniversary was shown all over the country. While living in Galena, she sold her self-designed clothing, first in a shop she ran, and then in one called “Wearable Art” that she shared with Janet Checker. Along with her artistic talents, Sidney is an amazing cook and was co-owner of “200 S. Main,” a



Galena restaurant. For “The Art Lives On,” the Center for the Arts' first exhibit, she created and donated many of the appetizers.

Al Miller, Sidney's late husband, had a commercial and fine arts career over more than fifty years. He was a partner and creative director of Motivation Dynamics Advertising Agency in Chicago, ran his own art school in Cincinnati, and had his work in galleries in New York and many other places. His art includes both realistic and abstract styles of portraiture, landscape and still life, executed in oil, acrylic, watercolor, and collage.



The Center for the Arts is very fortunate to be the recipient of such a generous and beautiful gift of Al's paintings. The fact that they were painted in Galena and are of Galenians makes them special indeed. It is wonderful that current Galena residents and visitors will now be able to enjoy them.


Hearts for the Arts Save the Date February 2, 2019
