

He taught classes, judged art competitions, and showed his work in various museums and galleries.



**SONGWRITERS SHOWCASE
Ted and Catherine Parrish
Performing as The Parrishes
April 18, 7-9 pm**

The Parrishes are an acoustic duo from Viroqua Wisconsin. Their original songs cross the bridge between folk and blues, using musical knowledge honed through decades of performing, recording, and teaching. Catherine's soaring vocals are the focal point of all the songs, with their multi-instrumental skills deployed on whichever instruments each song requires, whether guitar, ukulele, mandolin, banjo, or flute.

Ted and Catherine Parrish moved to Viroqua in 2007 after living 20 years in Chicago, where they taught at the renowned Old Town School of Folk Music. Since 2014 they have dedicated themselves to collaborating on their original acoustic music – songs and melodies that blend their musical styles and experiences. Their music

showcases the passion and skill developed over many years of dedication to their art.





May 4, 9 am—4 pm


The one-day workshop with Lisa will feature painting from life with a costumed model.

Volunteer of the Month *Cathy Dorwick*

Wandering down the hallway at the Center for the Arts, you may come to two charming paintings of farm animals. Hanging right outside her studio, they are the work of Cathy Dorwick. If the door is open, peep inside at her other paintings and perhaps see Cathy working on her latest. Or you may see her at the front desk, greeting visitors to the galleries. Either way, her warmth and enthusiasm will make you feel welcome.

Cathy discovered her passion for painting in 2002 when she took a night class and created a portrait of her daughter. Although she and her family moved frequently before settling in Galena, living in several different states, and even in Nicaragua for a time, whenever possible she would take classes to improve her skills. She has studied in Washington, Pennsylvania, and Indiana, among others.

Since moving here, Cathy has been able to spend

more time on her art—both painting and photography, her second love--and has exhibited several times. In 2014 she was a featured artist at the Galena State Bank, and in 2015 her work was in the Grace Episcopal Parish House Art Exhibit. In 2016, her portrait of school teacher Margaret Gardner was displayed at the Galena History Museum as part of "Women of History, Past, Present & Future."

Along with all this, she has served as the Artists' Guild's curator for the Chestnut Mountain Art Show as well as the Guild's facilitator and PR representative.



Currently, Cathy is studying under well-known Galena artist Janet Checker and exploring different styles of painting as well as different media, including acrylics, oils, and watercolors. She divides her time among her family, her art, and—happily for us—the Center for the Arts.
