The Art of Paul Chase Through January 4, 2020

The gallery is filled with the diversity of Paul's work—sculptures in marble, wood, copper, soapstone; paintings in acrylic, oil, and watercolor; and digital prints on canvas. So much to see and appreciate. Subject matter includes houses and landscapes of the Galena countryside and cityscape, often reconfigured to amaze and delight. Guitars are a dominant subject, which Paul has been creating for many years, having a show in Nashville, Tennessee in 2013, included over sixty sculptures.

Catch the Train in Galena with trains running November 29 - December 15

All Aboard!!! "Catch the Train in Galena" returns to the Center for a holiday celebration from 1-4 pm, Thursdays through Sundays from November 29 through December 15. The opening reception will be on Friday, November 29 from 5-7 pm in the lower level performance space of the Center.



Railway enthusiast Philip Jackman will display his N Scale operating trains for three weekends of running trains, including modules created by other train lovers. The large display features a variety of topography, with up to three trains running at a time. There will be long freight trains snaking around the layout, sleek streamliners from the golden age of train travel, steam trains from a bygone era and modern Amtrak passenger trains. New this year will be a module showing the train in East Dubuque, and another module showing a Wisconsin scene in all four seasons. The walls of the Center will be covered with railroad memorabilia, and an old-fashioned Christmas tree encircled by a train is sure to bring back holiday memories.

Volunteer of the Month Charlotte Kennedy

Char Kennedy is a woman known for both her artistic and culinary talents. Her multiple interests and activities have included sewing, weaving, quilting, playing tennis (and receiving many trophies), cooking, writing poetry, and painting. Both as an artist and a volunteer, she has been a part of the Center for the Arts from its beginnings.

By visitors and other volunteers at the Center, Char is probably best known for her fiber art and her paintings. She learned to sew as a child, even winning a Singer Sewing Contest. She did loom weaving for many years, and she is an expert quilter. Her beautiful pillows pieced from neckties show her skill and artistic eye. She began painting in the early 1990s when she was given some old canvases and paints. Today, she enjoys working in both oils and acrylics.

Besides exhibiting her work at the Center, Char can be counted on to supply yummy treats for opening nights. Cooking has long been one of her accomplishments. A home economics major in college, she taught "home ec" for many years in the Chicago suburbs of Villa Park and Highland Park. Her honors have included being a Fulbright Scholar and Teacher of the Year for Illinois—all while raising four children! Her joy in teaching and interest in healthy food have continued into her retirement. She has taught nutrition for Earth Day and recently gave a class in "flexitarian" cooking at Grace Episcopal Church. "Flexitarian," she explains, means healthy



eating that includes very small portions of meat.



One of Char's personal goals and activities is preserving family history for her grandchildren. Her own background is Polish. She grew up in the Polish neighborhood of Humboldt Park in Chicago; she speaks Polish, and has visited Poland three times. So that her grandchildren will know about their heritage and family, she has created "Heritage Boxes," which contain keepsakes, a family tree, and a copy of "Relative Reflections," a collection of family stories she wrote in her poetry group.

At this point in her life, Char wants to continue to pass along her knowledge and skills. She loves the idea of being a mentor and a teacher. "I want to share what I love and know with others," she says. Her enthusiasm, talent, and many skills make her a mentor anyone would be lucky to have.
