



# Songwriters' Showcase Thursday Sept 15 - 7 PM



## **Marques Morel and Brooke Byam**

Marques Morel and Brooke Byam are both songwriters, though they come from much different backgrounds.

Morel has been a wandering folk troubadour, street performer, activist for social justice and environmental issues, riverboat songman and bar-room singer for the last eight years. He has a rough-hewn approach to playing, singing, writing and living and performed mostly solo until meeting Brooke Byam.

Byam comes from a musical family and has been performing as a singer for at least 20 years. She has been named #1 independent country artist, performed for the Vice President, has been a Nashville performer and recording artist for ten years, and has had several roles as an actress in movies and

television shows as well as directing, writing and performing three seasons of her own variety show. She has a more refined approach than Morel, but together they make a truly interesting and compelling balance of music and song.

They are currently forming a band called The People, which is a conglomeration of many musical styles and has been called somewhere between rugged folk, smokey blues, dark country, and cowboy rock n' roll.

They perform everywhere from the street corner to the theatre and beyond.



#### Classical Guitarist Marcus DeJesus

Marcus DeJesus is a young guitarist originally from Brazil that currently lives in the Dubuque Tri State Area and teaches guitar at the Madison Metropolitan School District, Wisconsin and, at NISOM in Dubuque, Iowa. He has a master's degree in performance from Southern Illinois (Carbondale, Illinois) and bachelor's of art in music performance from Clarke University (Dubuque, Iowa). Living in the US for about ten years, Marcus has studied the guitar with Dr. Zane Merritt, Dr. Isaac Lausell, Dr. Miles McConnell, composition with Dr. Amy Dunker and voice with master John Lease. In Brazil, he has collaborated with the master Moacyr Teixeira Neto who teaches at the FAMES Music Conservatory situated in Vitoria, ES. That is where he studied during the summer of 2012 and has returned regularly to perform and lecture at the service of the school. He plays guitar made by Brazilian luthier Luiz Antonio Miranda.

Marcus began his studies on the instrument at the age of ten, performed in variety of jazz ensembles in the Midwest having his father as one of his first teachers. The Brazilian and in Brazil. Recently, Pat has had the chance to develop her skills in the fiber arts, and enjoys spinning, dyeing, weaving and knitting. She has even grown her own flax. This creativity and energy, along with her business and organizational skills, make her the ideal person for her new position.

Thinking about the Center, Pat says, "I have been very impressed with the Center for the Arts as it is, but I can also see a lot of growth potential. That's what I want to help with. I am very excited to get to work with so many talented people."



#### Volunteer of the Month - Board Member Charlene Buran Price

The first time Charlene Buran Price saw Galena, she and her late husband Bob were just driving through, but it was love at first sight. Entranced by the beauty of the town and the area, Charlene declared "I know I could paint here." At the time, they both had busy, full lives, but they never forgot Galena, and, in 1995, they moved to the Territory. Here, Charlene could, and did, paint. Twenty-one years later, she's still at it.

Although she has done landscapes, her recent paintings—oil on canvas, board or paper—are subtle and atmospheric studies of flowers. She sees painting as "an international language in a world that desperately needs greater communication among its people." You can often see some of her work in the Regional Artists' Gallery at the Center for the Arts, and her hand-crafted cards are carried in the gift shop. She also exhibits at Hello Galena and other Galena venues.

With her love of art, it is not surprising the Charlene wants to share it and make the arts accessible to others. After moving to Galena, she quickly began participating in the arts community: in the Artists' Guild, the Festival for the Arts, and Hello Galena. Involved in Vision 20/20 a few years ago, she channeled her enthusiasm and experience into helping make the Center for the Arts a reality.

"The Galena Center for the Arts has given great hope for finally achieving the dream I think all Galena's artists have always held—a home for not only visual arts but all forms of theater and music...," she says.
