








Center Receives 365Ink Impact Award for 2017


Please help us celebrate!

New Exhibit Starting Friday March 31



Songwriters Showcase - Thursday March 16 - 7PM



Just back from performances in Hawaii, Medicinal Purposes returns to the Songwriter's Showcase on March 16. Cowgirl Pearl Breitbach is a musical veteran who has raised an entire generation of gifted musicians and songwriters. Scott Guthrie is a songwriter/singer/guitarist who has spearheaded many projects over the years. Together, they are "Medicinal Purposes" and their music is original and fresh. Together they bring a new raw energy to their performances.

Robin Davis and Ted Williams are a new to the Songwriter's Showcase, and we're eager to hear them sing!

Something new for Songwriter's Showcase! The March 16th Showcase, featuring the groups "Medicinal Purposes" and "Robin and Ted", will be available on YouTube the day following the event.

Birdhouse72 will be recording audio and video of this showcase with their 4 camera HD video flypack...essentially a TV studio in a box. Birdhouse72 provides sound reinforcement services and multimedia production services in the tri-state area surrounding Dubuque, IA. Owner Andy Steil is a veteran of the local music scene and looks to bring professional level production to independent artists and small businesses.

The biggest advantage of this system is the ability to mix the live HD video feed from the cameras and the individual audio microphones in real time, saving the costly and time intensive process of transferring individual video and audio files to a computer-based editor and working from there. With Birdhouse72's HD video flypack setup, the recording and mixing process is essentially finished at the end of the performance.


Mindful Yoga continues through March 29

Insect Interactions in the Prairie - Thursday April 6 at 7 PM

On April 6th at 7 PM Richard Pearce will present and hour of fun and fascinating video clips he has recorded in nature. The videos are HD close ups of insects interacting with flowers in unusual and, in many cases, seemingly human ways, achieving shelter, food, and territorial dominance. It's all taken with a gyroscopically stabilized iPhone fitted with a macro lens -- a setup so portable that unusual occurrences can be captured as they happen during almost every nature excursion. Without the encumbrances of large cameras, lenses, or tripods and with some patient befriending of individual insects over time, nature can be shown in an accessible and enchanting way. Even folks who hate bugs should love these videos!

If you wander into the Center for the Arts on a Thursday afternoon, you're very likely to be greeted

by Terri Jackman, our Volunteer of the Month. Terri loves being at the Center, where she especially enjoys and appreciates the variety of art forms. "There is always so much to explore and see," she says. "The exhibits change, and I get a chance to meet the artists and discuss their craft."

Terri has been involved in the arts for most of her life. She began by singing in church and in musicals, including "Fiddler on the Roof" and others at the Grand, and currently sings with the Grace Episcopal Choir. In her 40's, she decided to try acting. She auditioned with Main Street Players, and was chosen for a part in "Musical Comedy Murders of 1940." It was while acting in this Nazi spy comedy that she met her future husband Phil. That was the beginning of two loves: acting and, of course, Phil.

Terri stayed with Main Street, acting in a variety of plays as well as working backstage with Phil. She especially enjoyed the children's shows he directed



when she was in charge of the kids backstage, no easy task. Her impressive resume includes plays with Galena Art Theater, Fly By Night, Back Street Players, and Bell Tower Theater. One of her favorite roles was that of M'Lyn in "Steel Magnolias."

As if all this weren't enough to keep her very busy, she is also an expert at counted cross stitch and produces beautiful pictures in thread. She shares this intricate art form with husband Phil. Between



them, they have created several portraits of trains and have been the featured artists for the Galena Cultural Arts Alliance and had a special show of their work.

Which brings us to trains—which they both love: cross stitch pictures of trains, model trains and their layouts, and riding on trains, their favorite form of travel. Now that they are retired, they look forward to more trips—especially on trains. It's just one more facet of a very talented and many-sided volunteer who contributes her time and energy to the Arts Center.
