


Workshops

Human anatomy is taught in schools of fine arts throughout the world. Two minute or five minute poses can show action and form, but rarely detail. Longer poses, thirty or forty minutes, can allow time for a detailed hand, face, or or costume.

We have great models—male, female, young and older. The artists use pencil, charcoal, paints, pastels, or whatever they chose.

It's a very low-key comfortable atmosphere, so if you are new to this discipline, please come. Your fellow artists are there to help.



Volunteer of the Month - Gladdy Ressler

Gladdy Ressler was born into music. Growing up in a family of ten kids, she reminisces that they had no television, so their entertainment was singing around the piano. She and three sisters sang folk music in four-part harmony, and she and a brother pooled their meager funds to buy a guitar. When the family moved to Epworth, Iowa, the local seminarians taught them to play and joined in the music-Surrounded making. bv harmony and family, Gladdy grew up to carry and share those values through her life.

As an adult, Gladdy took time off from performing to raise her seven children, though



music was always in her heart. A few years ago, she was able to return to performing and jamming with other musicians—and the local music scene hasn't been the same since. She can be heard singing and playing with The Ressler Family Band, Gladdy & the Soulmates, and the Bluegrass Alumatics. Along with her own song-writing, singing and playing, she has opened many opportunities for others. She is very generous to other musicians, creating venues for them to perform in as well as giving them encouragement. She and her brother Bob began and run Open Mic on Wednesday evenings in the Blu Room at Breezer's Pub in Dubuque, and she started a monthly bluegrass jam at the Smokestack in Dubuque's Millwork District. For her efforts and influence, she was recently awarded the 365Inc. Impact Award for Music.

Given all that and the fact that she had previously sung at one of the Center for the Arts' Singer/Songwriter evenings, it's no surprise that she was asked to organize a concert of talented women musicians for *Broad Ideas*, the Center's presentation of many different arts by women. Billed as *A Night of a Dozen Roses*, the show included performances by twelve talented musicians, including Gladdy herself, playing and singing. About the Center for the Arts, Gladdy is very appreciative that another music venue is available for local talent. "A phenomenal thing is going on here," she says-- high praise from one who contributes so much to our area.
